



2011 was a banner year for the Missouri Veterans Commission. In our Cemetery Program, we opened our fifth operational cemetery at Fort Leonard Wood. National Shrine Status became a stated goal and our pre-certifications were up.





The Homes Program had seven successful VA Surveys. Nine of our Nurse Aides were recognized as national leaders and we served over 1,949 Veterans as the provider of choice for skilled nursing care.

Our Veterans Service Program reached a milestone as Missouri's Veterans received \$1,005,867,000 in benefits, compensation and pension. We began working closely with the Veterans Benefits Administration and the Missouri Association of Veterans Organizations (MAVO) to reduce the amount of time it takes to process a claim.

Partnering with MAVO and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs helped us establish the three key messages for Missouri Veterans: See a Veterans Service Officer, Sign up for VA Healthcare, and Join a Veterans Service Organization. Working together is making a significant difference for everyone.

Missouri has always been committed to its citizens who have sacrificed for our freedom. It remains an honor to serve those who served us.



FY 2011 Successes

For Fiscal Year 2011 the Missouri Veterans Commission focused on the following initiatives that were designed to further enhance the services provided to Missouri's Veterans. Those initiatives were:

Implement the five recommendations of the Listening Post Report

- We completed and published a Missouri Guide to Veterans Benefits.
- We established an Outreach Task Force with our Veteran Service Partners.
- We established a Benefits Task Force with our Veteran Service Partners.
- We formalized our support for the Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program.
- We promoted educational awareness and a call for action regarding the solvency of the Veterans Commission Capital Improvement Trust Fund.

Establish processes to synchronize our FY 2011 Game Plan with VISN 15, VISN 16, VBA, and NCA.

- We communicated our strategic direction with United States Department of Veterans Affairs leadership.
- Our programs and initiatives communicated with like programs and initiatives of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
- We worked toward synchronizing our strategic direction for FY 2012 with the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

Develop Mechanisms with our Veterans Service Partners to communicate our three joint key messages.

- We developed and implemented a poster campaign to promote our joint key messages with the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and the Missouri Association of Veterans Organizations.

For FY 2012, the Missouri Veterans Commission has identified three strategic initiatives that reflect today's challenges while providing a platform for boldly moving into the future. As provided by the Commission at the April 11, 2011 commission meeting, our strategic initiatives for FY 2012 are:

Promote a Veteran centered culture within the Missouri Veterans Commission

1. Focus on Veterans centered care, family communication, and service efficiency in the Homes Program.
2. Focus on a personalized pre-certification process, family service, and shrine status goal in the Cemetery Program.
3. Focus on personalized service to Veterans and implementing the recommendations of the Benefit & Outreach Task Forces in the Veterans Service Program.

Develop and implement mechanisms with our service partners to communicate, coordinate, cooperate, and collaborate (C4).

1. Communicate our Mission, Vision, and Goals
2. Coordinate our planning and schedules
3. Cooperate in joint events
4. Collaborate on strategic direction
5. Develop and publish a Communication Guide to focus and synchronize our direction

Expand our Veteran Outreach Horizon

1. Have a formal presence at the State Veterans Service Organization Conventions and VA Planning meetings. Invite service partners to our strategic meetings.
2. Develop and execute a survey tool to assess the members of individual MAVO and student veterans organizations.
3. Locate, contact & present to Missouri student veteran organizations.
4. Expand our web presence in social media.


Budget 2013 and Beyond

The Missouri Veterans Commission continues to work to identify additional sources of funding to ensure the future of its three core programs.


The chart shows historic and projected revenue sources and fund drawdown through 2014.

We have received numerous pledges of support by our elected officials to solve this funding challenge.


We look forward to working with our elected officials as we continue to serve those who served us.




2011 Key Indicators




The largest percentage of expenditures are for the Veterans Homes, followed by the Veterans Services Program, Veterans Cemeteries, and then Veterans Service Officer Grants. Expenditures for the homes have continued to increase over the years due to the growth in available beds and census. The Veterans Cemetery appropriations have grown with the opening of a fifth operational Veterans Cemetery at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri.



In 2001, the Missouri Veterans Commission began a Veterans Service Grant Program. In its first year, the program awarded over \$400,000 in grants to six Veterans Service Organizations. This program has allowed the Commission to assist Veterans Service Organizations in Missouri to continue providing services and assistance to Veterans. In 2011 we disbursed \$1 million to our current partner organizations including: American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Disabled American Veterans, Vietnam Veterans of America, and AMVETS.




The Missouri Veterans Commission has created a cemetery network so that every Missouri Veteran will have reasonable access to a Veterans cemetery. Five cemeteries are in operation at this time; Springfield, Higginsville, Bloomfield, Jacksonville, and Fort Leonard Wood, which opened August 2010.




Of the budgeted staff for fiscal year 2011, 94% of MVC employees are located in our seven Veterans Homes around the state. Approximately 4% are in Veterans Services Program and Central Office, while the remaining 2% are located at our five State Veterans Cemeteries.


2011 Key Indicators




The Missouri Veterans Homes Program operates seven exemplary Homes with 1,350 skilled nursing care beds. The Homes Program has a national reputation for excellence in quality outcomes, resident and family satisfaction and regulatory compliance. The Homes maintained a census of 99% throughout FY11 which resulted in care provided for 1,949 Veterans.



Missouri Veterans Homes continue to be the skilled nursing care facilities of choice for Missouri's Veterans. Even while maintaining a census of 99% the waiting list continues to grow. On June 30, 2011 the waiting list statewide was 1,615 an increase of 103 during the fiscal year.



Missouri Veterans Homes survey our Veterans to determine their level of satisfaction with our services. Statewide our residents expressed a 91% satisfaction rate. The American Healthcare Association conducted a nationwide resident satisfaction survey with a 85% satisfaction rate. 2008 is the latest report available from AHCA.



Missouri Veterans Homes offer excellent volunteer opportunities for individuals who would like to serve Veterans. Service ranges from companionship with individuals or working with groups to clerical tasks. In Fiscal Year 2011 a total of 164,780 hours were volunteered at the seven Veterans Homes. What a great way to give back to our brave men and women who have sacrificed to protect and preserve the freedom of this great nation!
