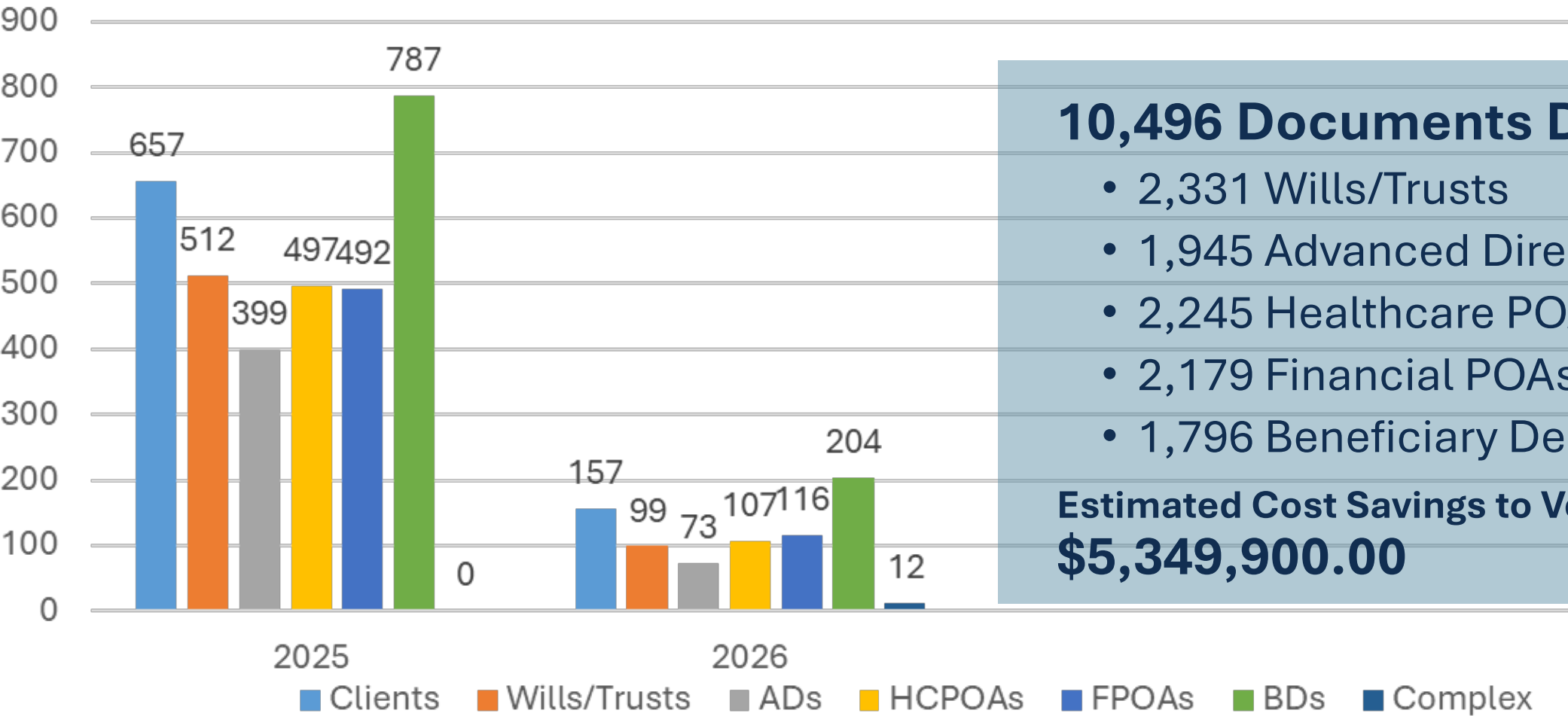

 - Completion date 10/3/26
 - C Unit construction is currently in design, scheduled pre-bid 8/6/26
 - Project remains over budget
- COVID19 – VA Construction Grant
 - HVAC Improvement for Isolation and Quarantine areas in Cape Girardeau, St Louis, Mt Vernon, Warrensburg, St James, and Cameron are in construction.
 - Wi-Fi upgrades at Mexico and St Louis are in construction. St James is completed and awaiting ITSD to activate.
 - Access Control construction in Mexico is completed. Warrensburg is in construction. Cape Girardeau and St James are pending construction
 - COVID19 grant projects must be completed by 9/17/26

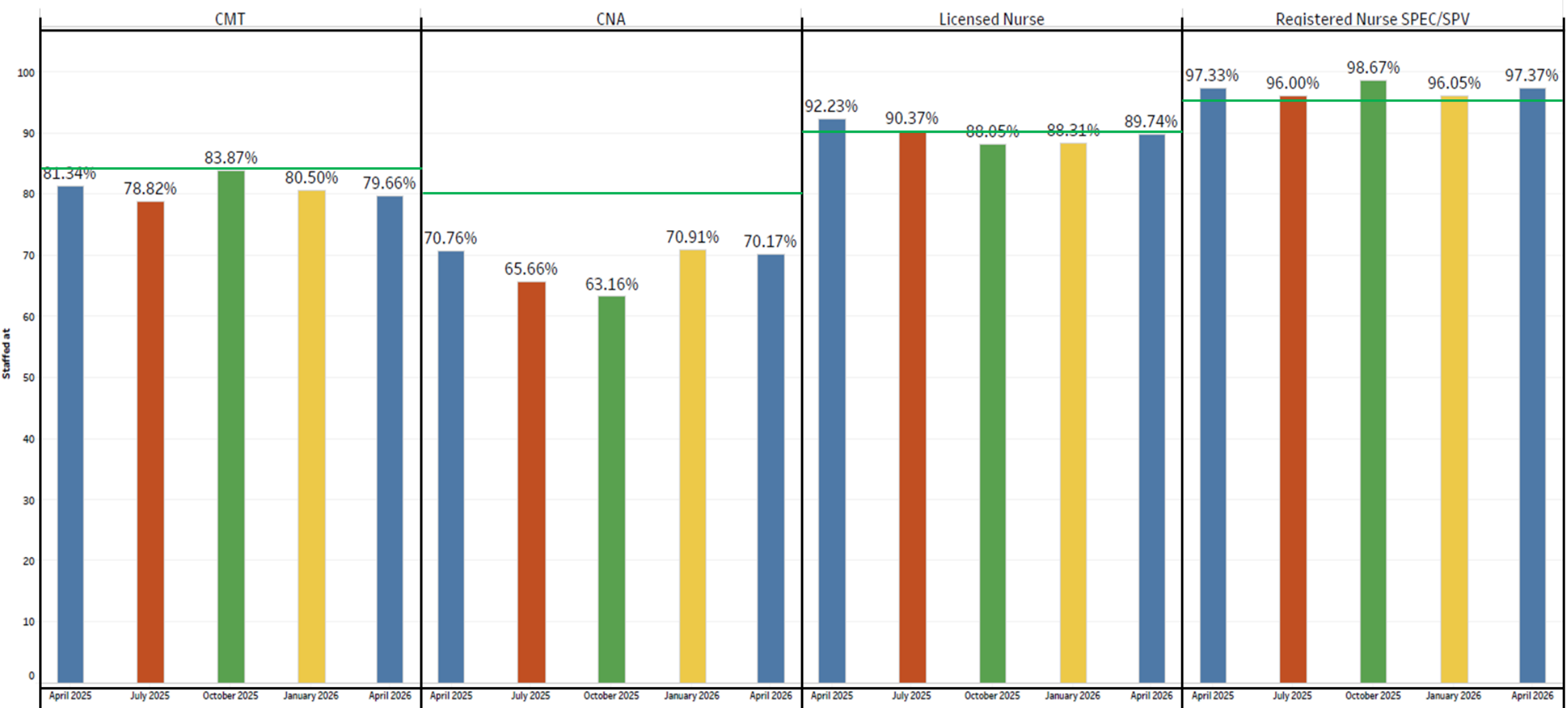

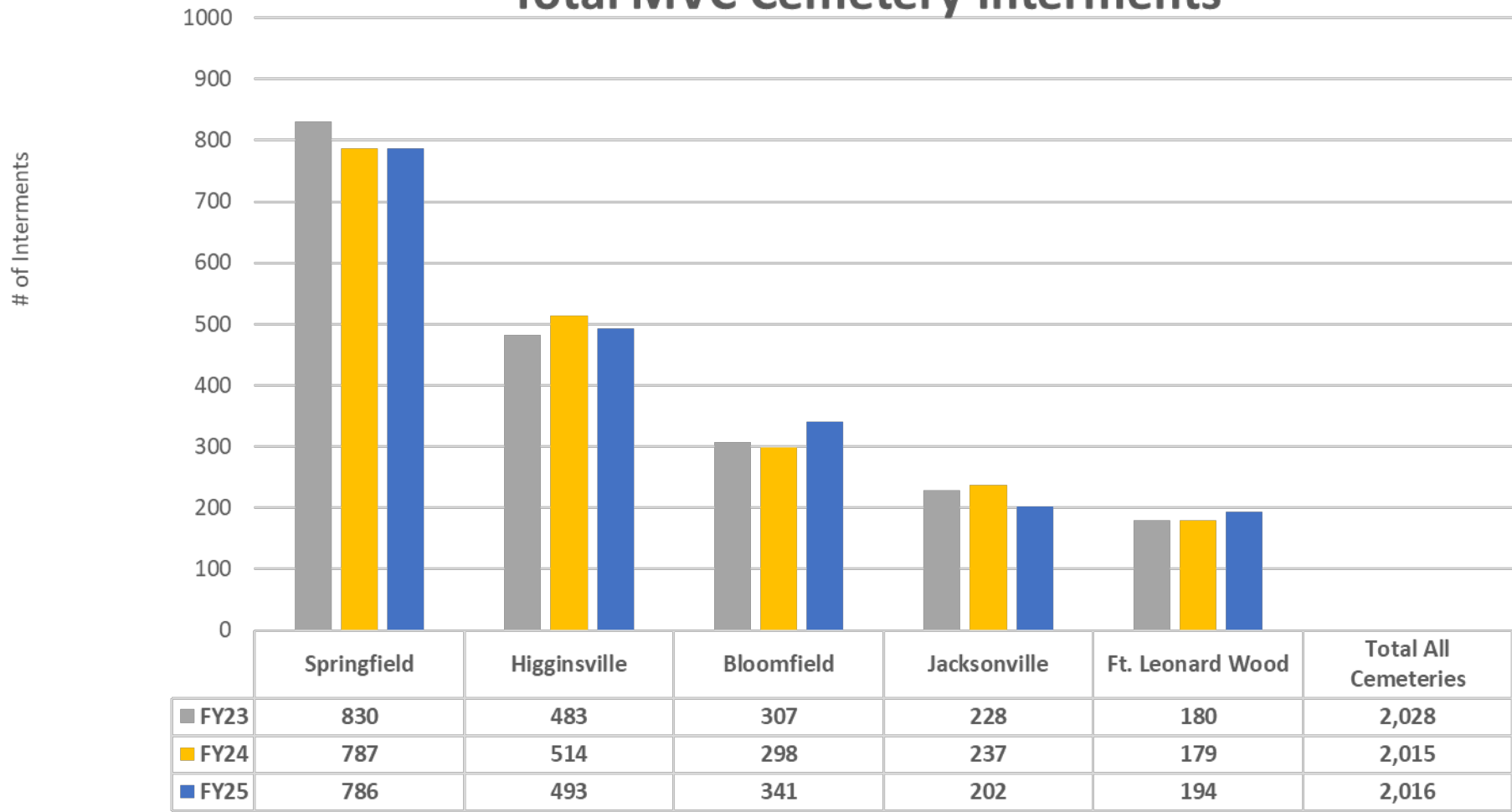

Wait Times

- 4.6 days - Average wait time for an appointment to see a Missouri Veterans Commission Veterans Service Officer.
- 14 days – Longest wait time.
- 1 day – Some offices can accommodate same day appointments.

Contributing Factors

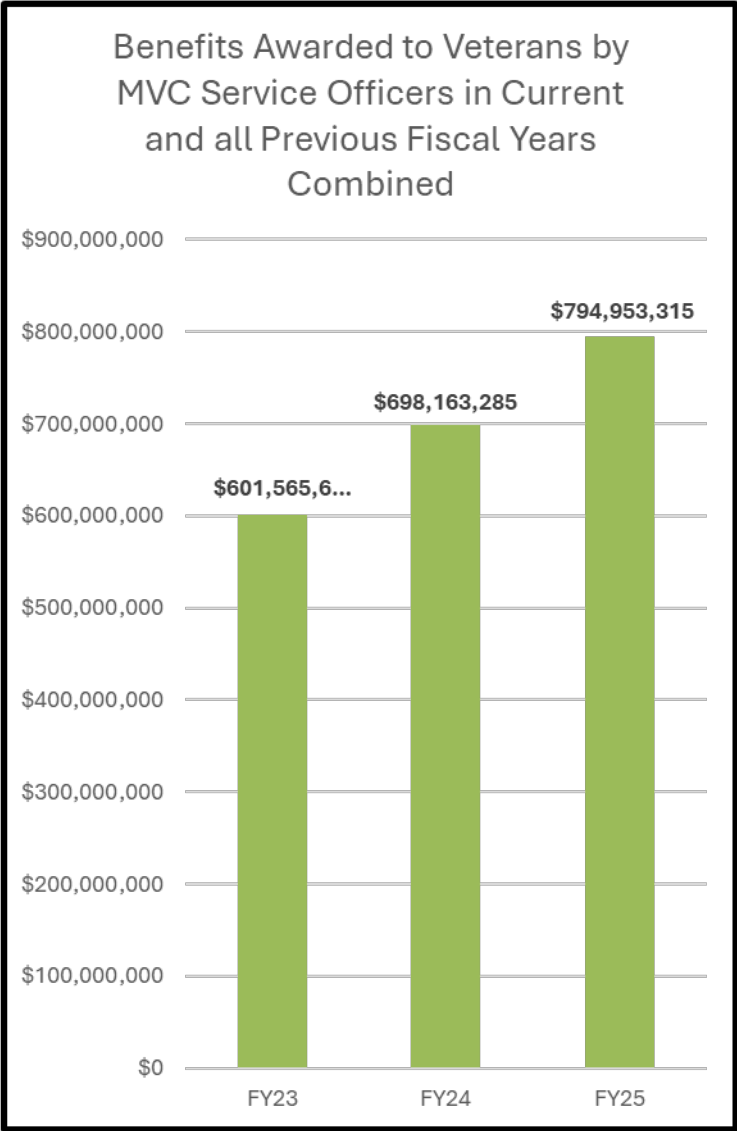
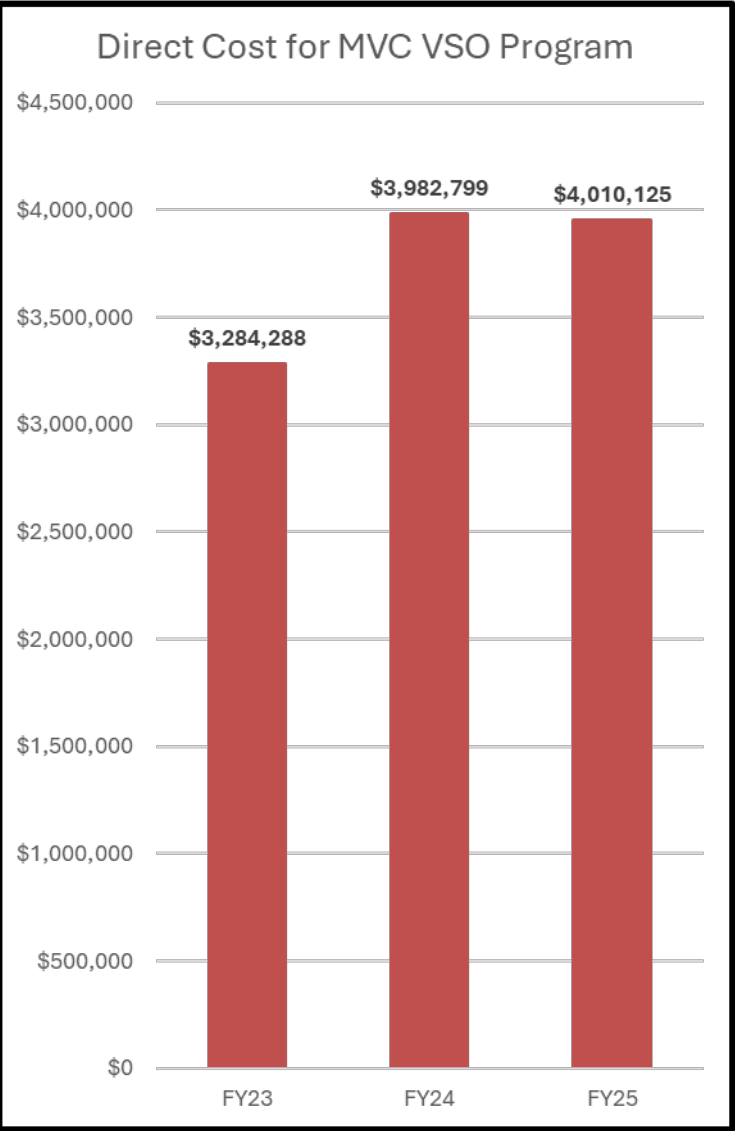
- Inexperience
- 56% (27 of 48) of servicing Veterans Service Officers have less than two years experience.
- 14 of the 27 are still in training/mentoring phase of employment.
- Ratio of Veteran to VSO.

Possible Solutions

- Recent pay increases and improved work culture should reduce turnover and increasing our knowledge base.
- Increase number of VSO's and position in high demand locations.
- Invest in a claims management system automating some of the administrative responsibilities of our Veterans Service Officers.

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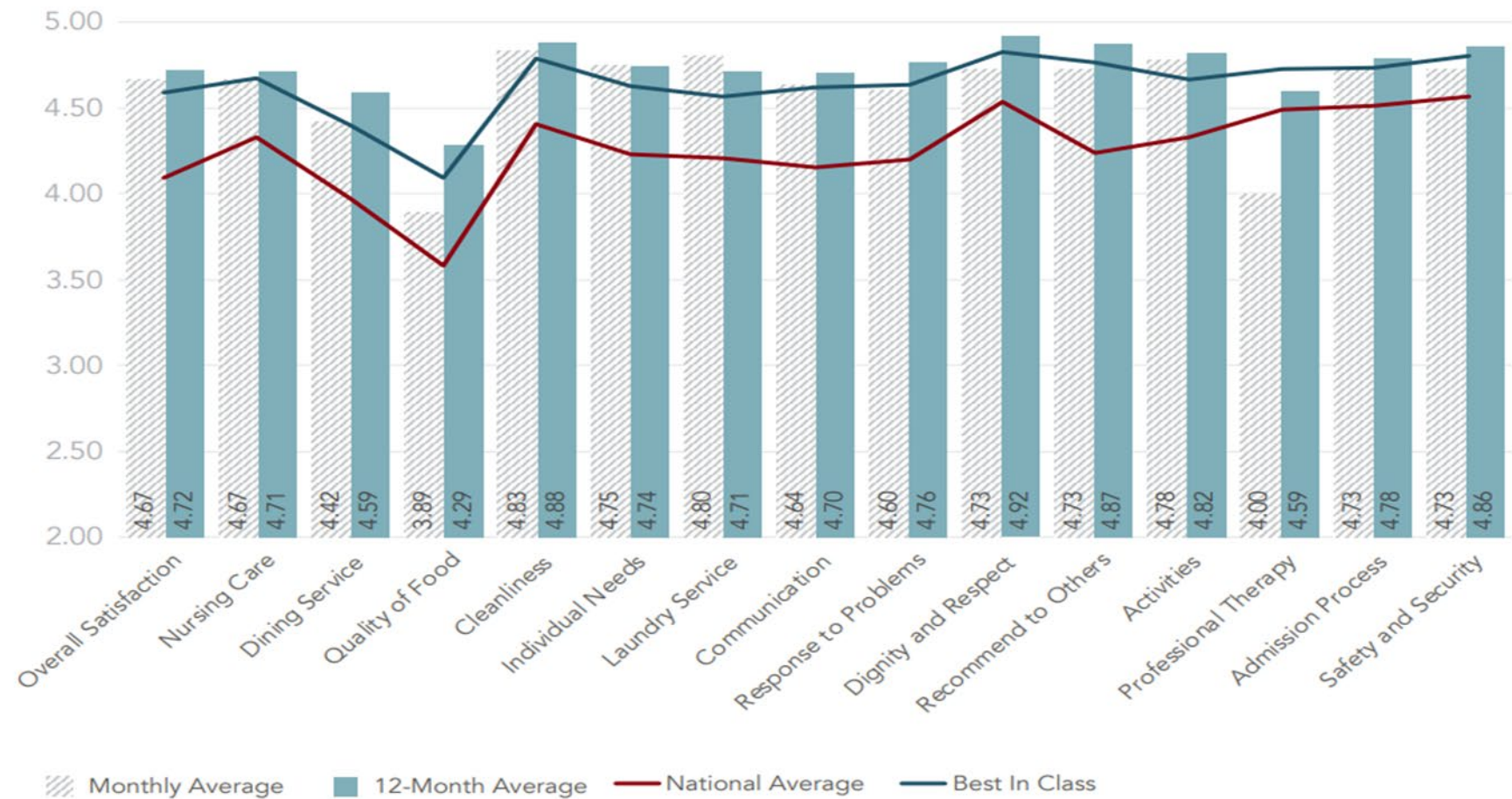

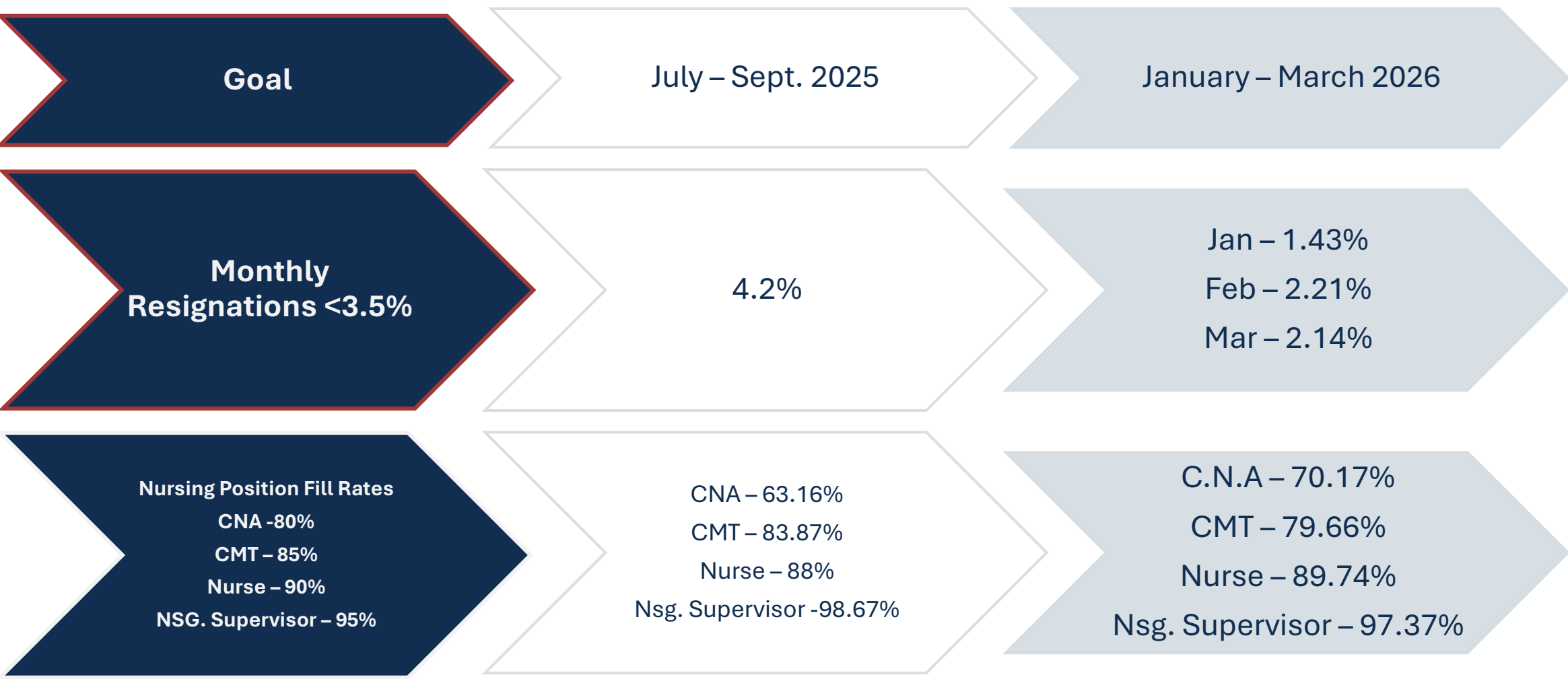

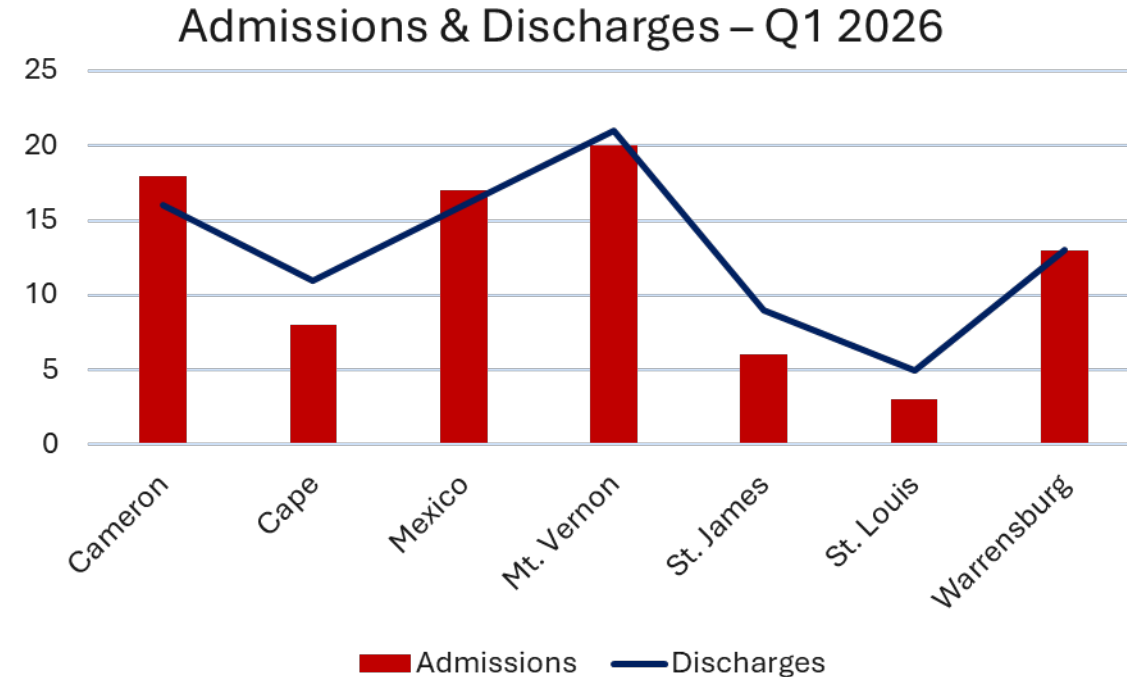
