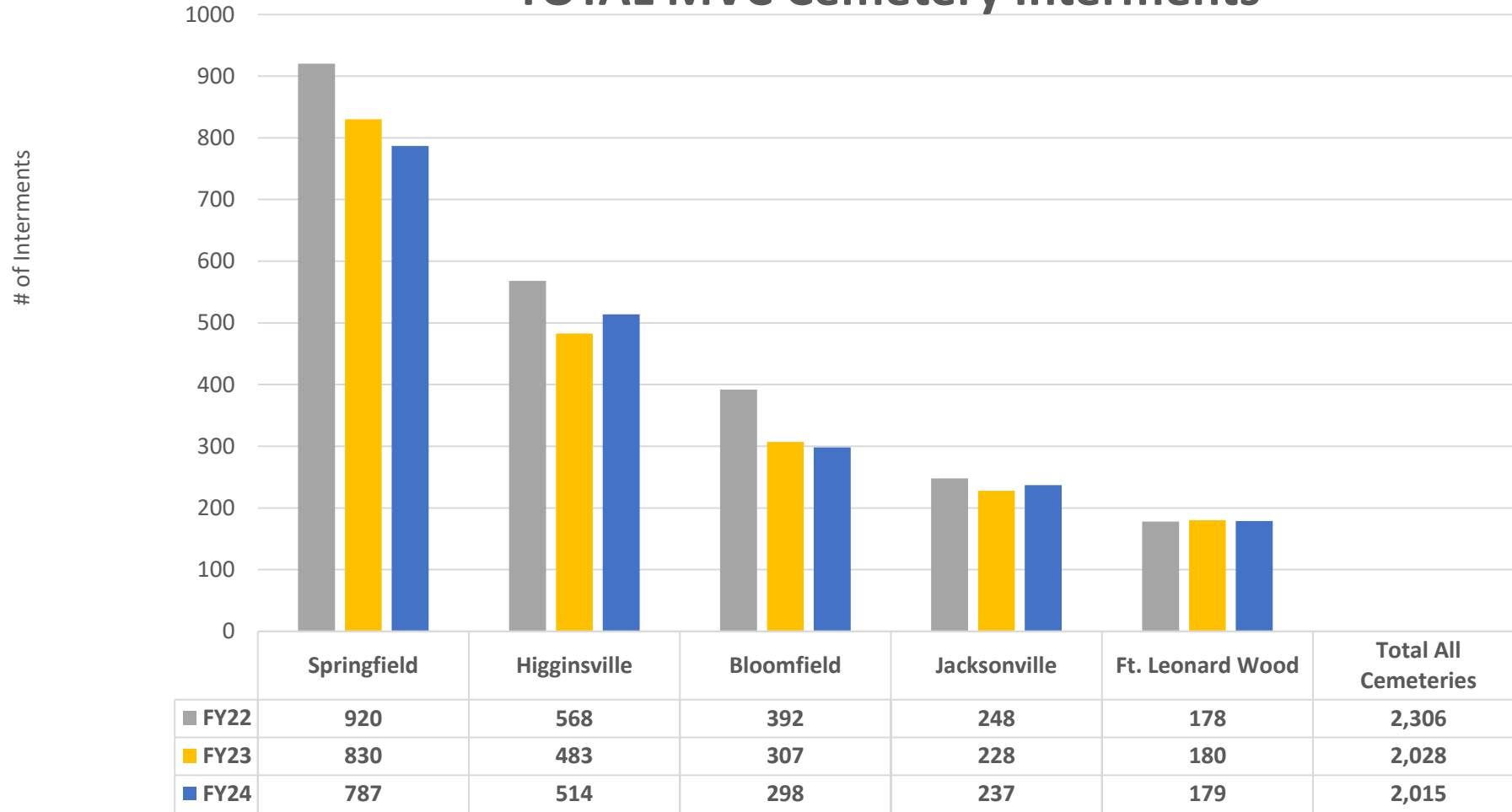

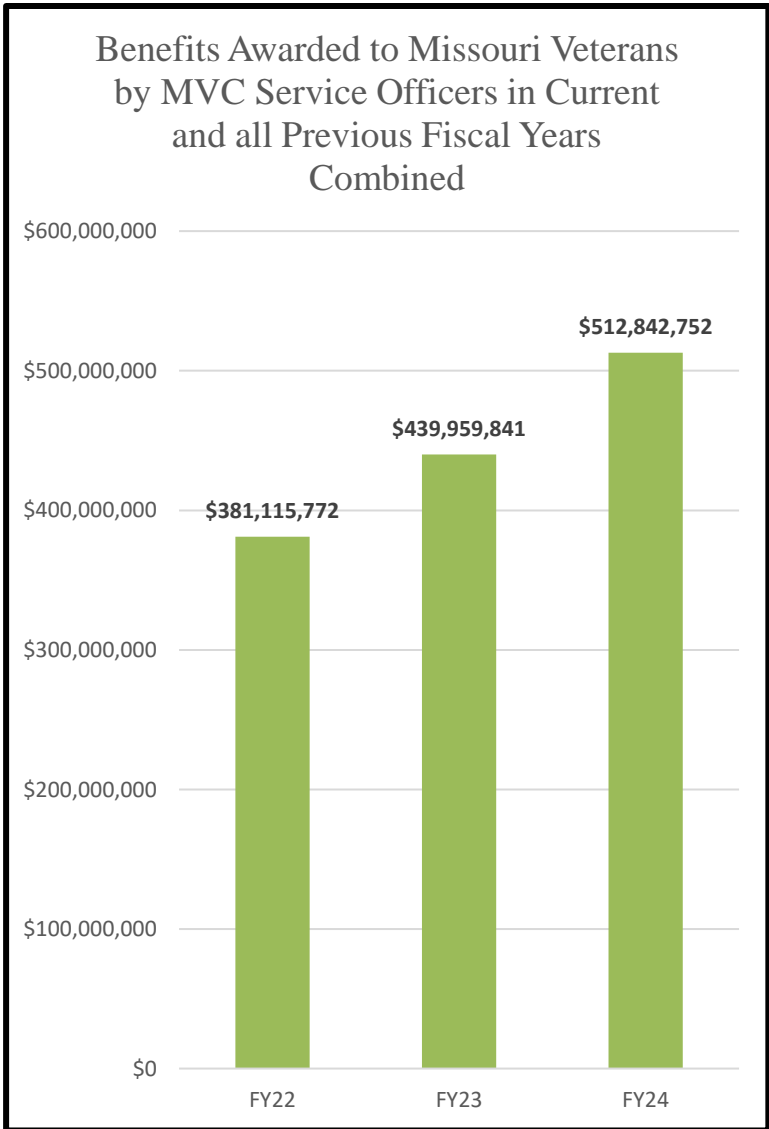

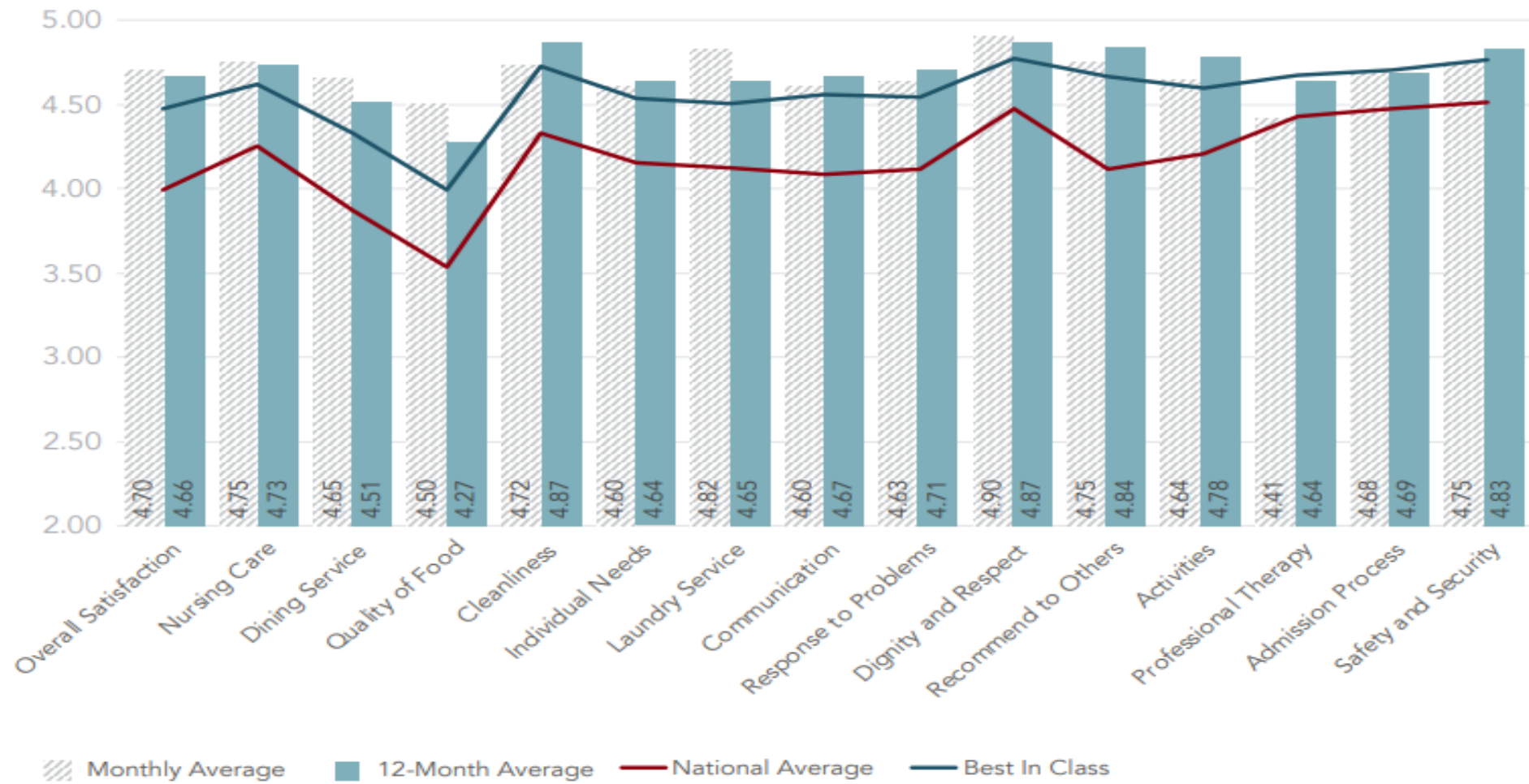

 - Increased .10% this quarter (as of 10/2/24)
- Increase Monthly Room & Board - \$2,697
 - Effective January 1, 2025
 - COLA 2.5%
- CMS Final Staffing Rule – May 10, 2024
 - 3.48 hours per resident day (HPRD= hours of care to each resident divided by total nursing hours worked divided by census)
 - 0.55 RN & 2.45 CNA
 - Requires a 24/7 RN (above the 0.55 RN)
 - 3 Phase implementation (rural facilities)
 - Phase 1 –Facility Assessment requirements. Effective **August 8, 2024**
 - Phase 2 –3.48 HPRD total staffing and 24/7 RN. Effective **May 2027**
 - Phase 3 –0.55 RN and 2.45 CNA requirements. Effective **May 2029**

MVH vs. CMS Final Rule:

- As of September 30, 2024 MVH average staffing
 - 3.66 HPRD (3.48 required)
 - **0.33 RN HPRD (0.55 required)**
 - 2.7 HPRD C.N.A (2.45 required)

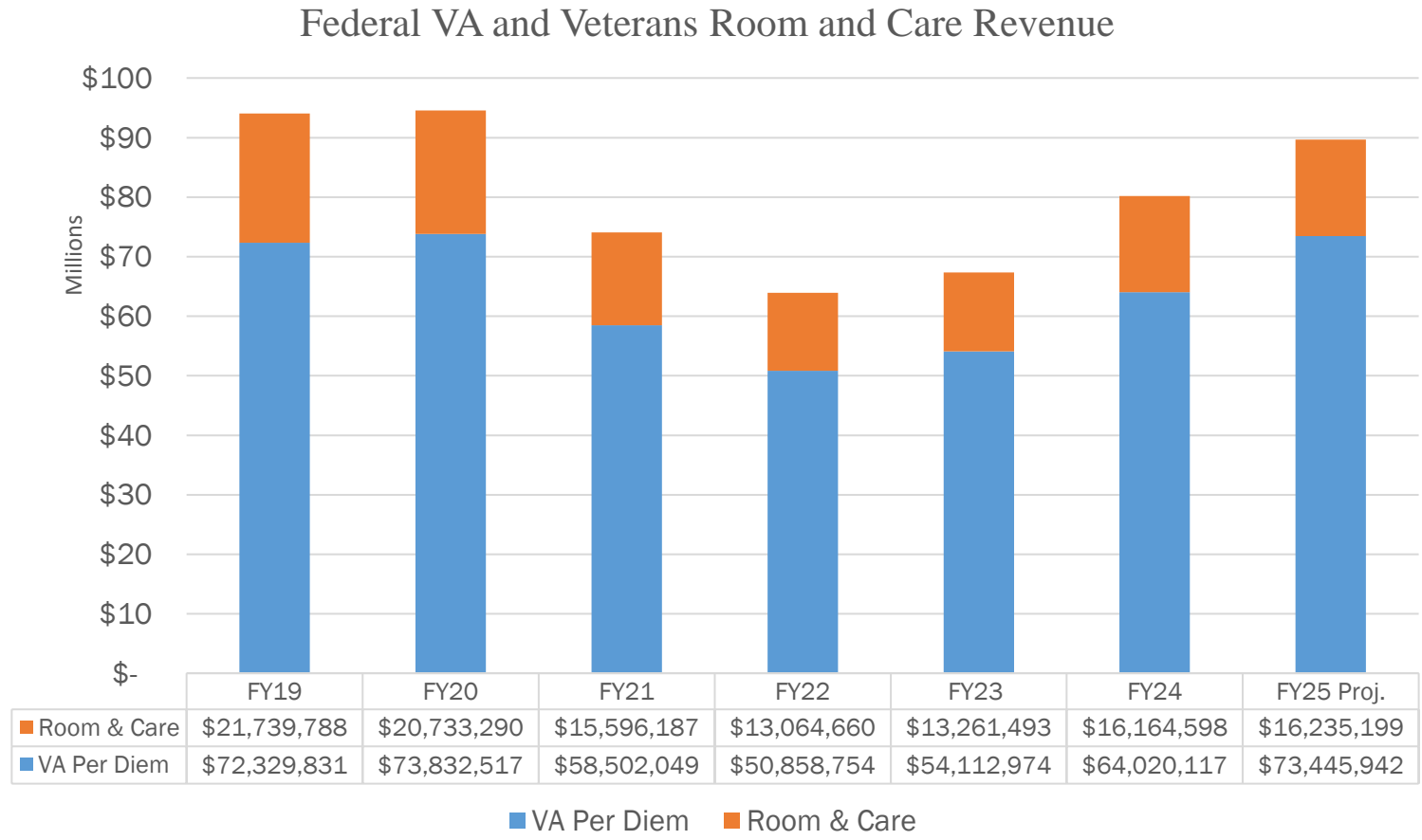
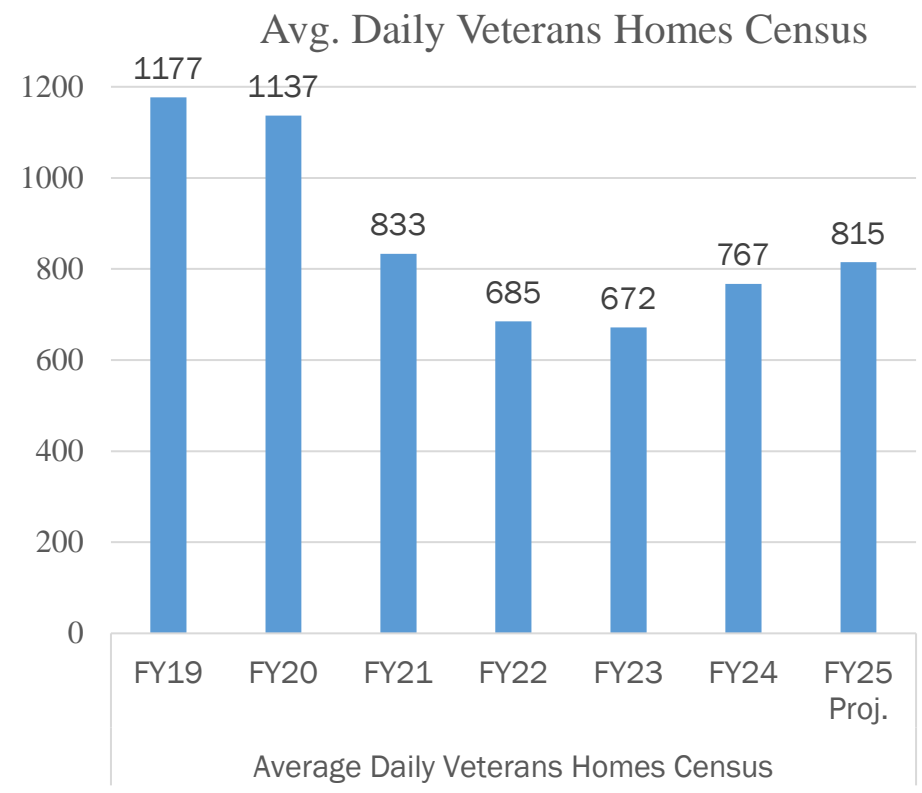

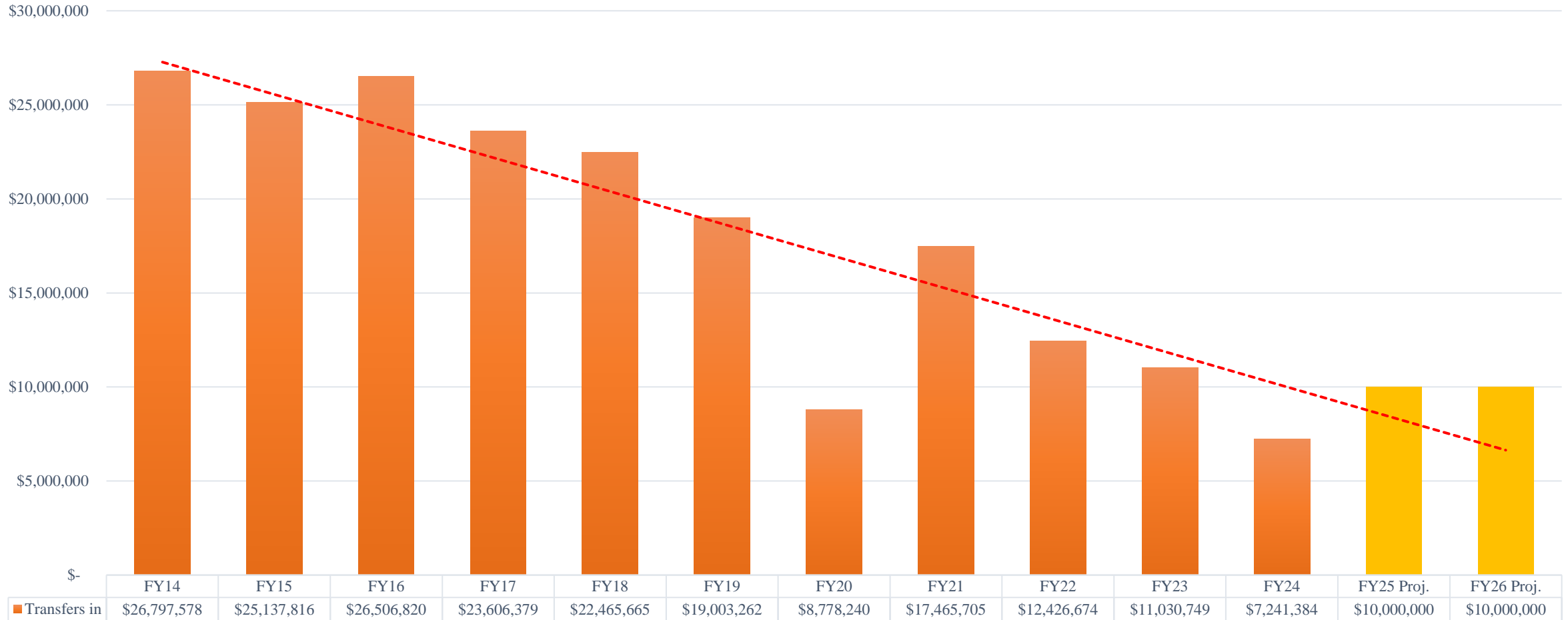

Important Notes/Assumptions:

- MVC can proceed with St. Louis A Unit construction at no reimbursement from the VA in FY25; project estimate reduced to FMDC estimate (design estimate is significantly higher)
- MVC obligates Springfield columbarium and preplaced crypts in FY26 (both appropriated)
- MVC is able to move forward with completing St. Louis C Unit construction in FY26 (currently in litigation)
- MVC is able to secure the core reallocation to afford Homes utilities through the Homes Fund
- MVC is unable to project the \$13M transfer into VCCITF from medical MJ due to the significant revenue reduction into Veterans Health and Care fund since the passage of Adult Use MJ
- MVC builds columbarium walls in FLW and Jacksonville beginning in FY27 as they will reach capacity in 2030 according to data science projections



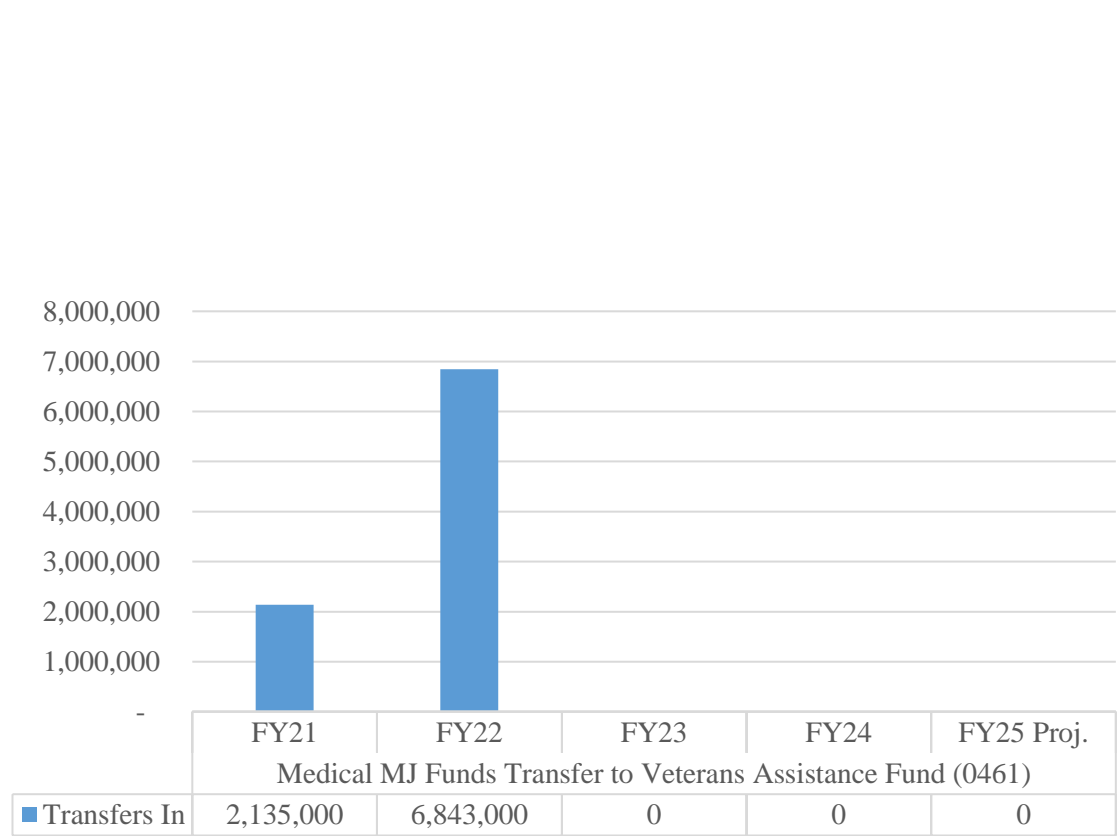
MEDICAL MARIJUANA REVENUE – IMPORTANT NOTES

- Significant reductions in Medical Marijuana sales will impact the Medical Marijuana transfer in to support MVC major fund solvency
 - We receive a portion of the 4% of the sales tax of the below listed sales:
 - February 2023: \$31M
 - August 2023: \$22M
 - August 2024: \$15M
- MVC receives a portion of the 4% sales tax proceeds
- MVC is unable to share whether this impact will affect FY25, but is sure it will impact FY26
- No Medical Marijuana transfers have been completed for FY25 to date
 - These transfers are typically completed by September or October

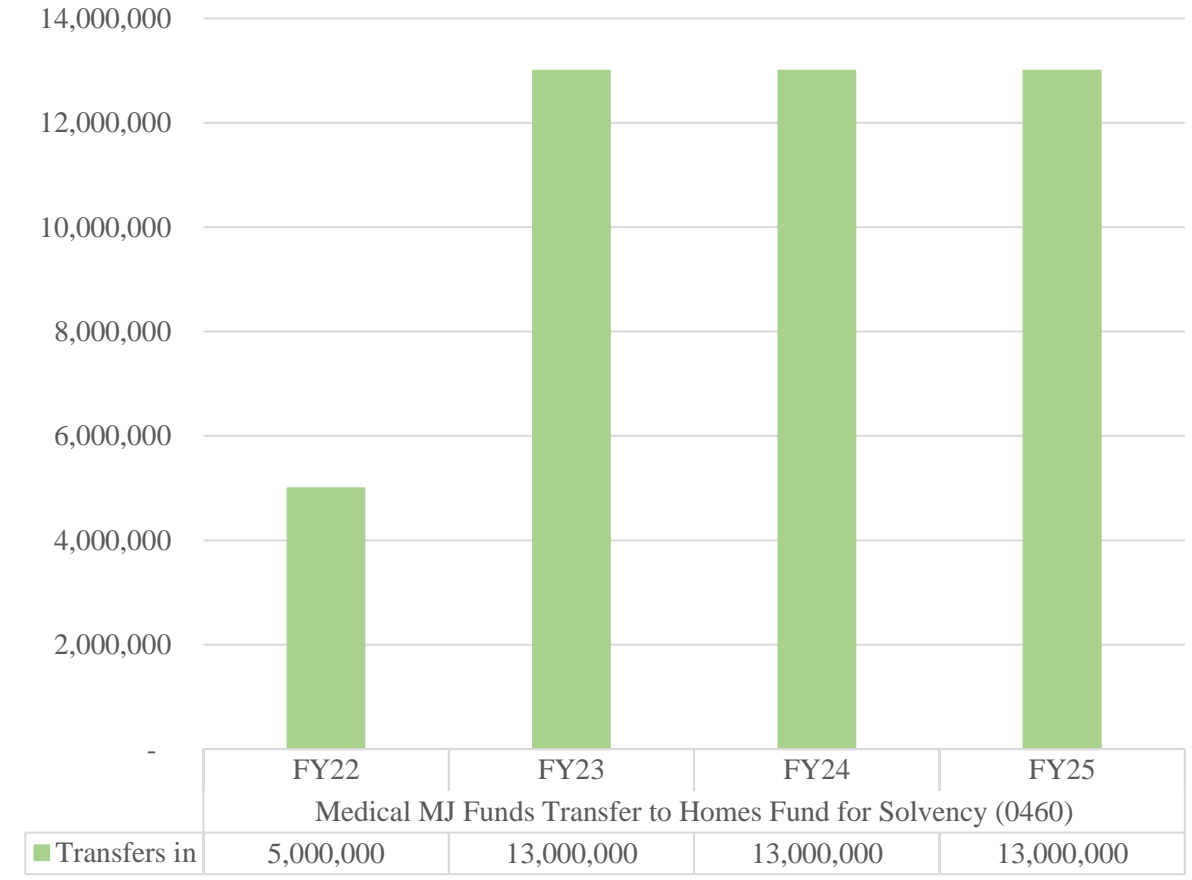
